



If you live in the Northeast and want to achieve a more native and drought-tolerant landscape, download the plan below. You can bring it to a local landscaper or implement it yourself.

John Gidding calls this plan "a clover and phlox oasis." In it you'll find clover lawn, phlox, and other native and drought-friendly plants that need very infrequent watering and maintenance once established. Your beautiful new yard will be equipped to withstand periods of extreme heat and drought.

What You'll Need

- Clover seeds
- Phlox plants
- Sweet pepperbush
- New Jersey tea
- Highbush blueberry
- Eastern redbud
- White pine
- Compost
- Garden tools (rake, tiller, watering can or hose)
